



The meeting of the young Mary with the older Elizabeth was an extraordinary encounter. Good news becomes great news when it is shared. Before Jesus came to the rest of the world at Christmas, Elizabeth had the extraordinary privilege of having the Christ child play her a visit in the womb of Mary. It was so great an honour that the child she herself was carrying leapt for joy. That child would be named John and would grow up to be the last and greatest of the prophets – the messenger preparing the way for the coming of the Saviour. He was destined to be a man linking the old to the new and a beacon pointing people to God’s son.

Why Unleashing the Holy Spirit Will Lead You to a More Joy-Filled Life

This Christmas can be the moment when you start living a more joyful and fulfilled life. In my experience all Catholics have received the Holy Spirit, but most Catholics have kept him locked up in a spiritual closet. This Christmas is the time to open that spiritual closet and allow the Holy Spirit to consume you and teach you significant insights into living a more joyful and fulfilled life.

Seeing Jesus in Others

In today’s Gospel the pregnant Mary visits the pregnant Elizabeth’s home. Upon Elizabeth greeting Mary, the gospel reads, “...and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit...” (Luke 1:41). This is followed by Elizabeth recognizing whom Mary is pregnant with. Of course Elizabeth knew that Mary was pregnant with a boy named Jesus, but it is only through the Holy Spirit that she could comprehend who Jesus is, referring to him as “my Lord.” Remember, many could not, or outright refused to accept this reality even when facing Jesus face to face. Herein lies the first lesson that Elizabeth teaches us about the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit helps us recognize Jesus Christ in others. The Holy Spirit allows us to see what our eyes alone cannot. The Holy Spirit allows us to see Christ in our whining children, in our annoying spouse, in the drivers during rush hour and in the homeless on the streets.

Seeing Jesus in Yourself

The second key to a more joyful life is seeing Christ in ourselves. The world tells us that we are only good as our utility or the letters following our names. Fortunately, the Holy Spirit shows us that the only letters that matter to God are the “S” and “T” before our names. The Holy Spirit helps us see ourselves as temples of Christ.

Seeing Jesus in the Mass

Finally, there is no greater spiritual privilege for us as Catholics than the Mass. Before I became Catholic one of my main objections to going to Mass was because it was “boring.” A friend of mine bluntly told me, “Maybe it’s you who’s boring.” I now agree. We’ve lost a sense of the wonder awe that is before us at mass. Through the Holy Spirit, Christ becomes present in body, blood and divinity in the Eucharist. If we recognize this, we can finally have our hearts opened to receive the grace Jesus wants to give us. If there is one thing I’d like you to take away is that the Holy Spirit will make life anything but boring. In fact life will become more fulfilling and joyful.
