THE PRAYER OF SAINT OSCAR ROMERO PROPHETS OF A FUTURE NOT OUR OWN

It helps, now and then, to step back and take a long view. The Kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is even beyond our vision. We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work. Nothing we do is complete, which is a way of saying that the Kingdom always lies beyond us.

No statement says all that could be said. No prayer fully expresses our faith. No pastoral visit brings wholeness. No set of goals and objectives include everything.

This is what we are about. We plant the seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise. We lay the foundations that will need further development. We provide yeast that produces far beyond our capabilities.

We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something, and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest.

We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker. We are workers, not master builders; ministers, not messiahs. We are prophets of a future not our own.

Archbishop Oscar Romero was assassinated in March 1980 because he spoke out against social injustice in his country of El Salvador. He was canonized on Oct. 14, 2018.

This prayer encourages a spirituality that strengthens us inwardly but leads us outward to answer God's call to justice – a spirituality that is not guided by numbers or successful outcomes of events. It calls us to trust that the Holy Spirit is with us -- that doing one's best, is enough to sustain us and our trust in God – that God will send other people after us to continue the journey of justice in the world.
