One of the saddest things in life is seeing people who don't have a sense of purpose and end up taking their own life. On June 8th celebrity chef, Anthony Bourdain took his own life in a Paris hotel room. On August 11, 2014 comedian Robin Williams commits suicide in his home. In April of this year former wife of the rock legend Elvis Presley, Priscilla Presley revealed that Elvis' drug induced heart attack was actually suicide.

What do these men have in common? Well they were all "living the good life" from the perspective the world. Wealthy, every material desire, popular, family... What went wrong? Were they not living heaven on earth?

Living a Life of Purpose

Living a purpose-filled life has nothing to do with achieving goals or accumulating riches. Even cherished things like a family won't always sustain a sense of purpose. Luckily she has God as her rock.

Even if we manage to achieve all the glory and aspirations in this life, without God, we'll fall flat on our face. Once there is no way up in life, the only other way is a hard fall down.

While achieving goals or accumulating riches is not inherently evil, they will not inspire us with an infinite sense of purpose. In today's first reading Isaiah prays, "The Lord called me before I was born, while I was in my mother's womb he named me" (Isaiah 49:1). Whether you are successful real estate agent with a Tesla on your driveway or a new immigrant, who's working odd jobs to sustain his family, God had you in mind long before you were conceived... and God doesn't make mistakes. God has a purpose for you to be his instrument in His world. The Church calls this our universal vocation.

In today's Gospel we are introduced to John the Baptist. Like celebrities, John had every opportunity to live "the good life." His father, Zachariah, was a temple high priest, which was a prestigious position. John appeared to be conscious of his greater purpose, so much so, that he abandoned the comforts of his home life to seek out his vocation without any distractions (Luke 1:80). Little did he know that God had something planned for him that was even greater than his father's position; to prepare people for the public appearance of Jesus Christ.

God has a purpose for you and it's much greater than any purpose we can make up for ourselves.
