The Face of a Confirmed Catholic

Jose was 13-year-old young man living in Sahuayo, Mexico. On a February evening as Jose and his family were finishing dinner, loud banging could be heard on the front door. "Policia Federales!" yelled a man on the other side of the door. The front door burst open. Yelling and screaming ensued. Jose's family was beaten and arrested. Jose was dragged away from his family in handcuffs.

What was Jose's family's crime? They were Catholic.

In 1928 the Mexican government declared war on Catholicism. Churches were boarded shut and people were forced to renounce their faith in Jesus Christ.

Jose was violently asked to renounce his faith in Jesus. His response? "Viva Cristo Rey!" "Long live Christ the King!" Jose was tortured yet he stilled cried out "Viva Cristo Rey!" Beaten and humiliated, soldiers forced Jose to march through his village to the graveyard. Jose was forced to dig his own grave. Falling to his knees, he made the sign of the cross with blood dripping from his head. He was then shot. Jose lived a life and died a death like that of Jesus.

Jose Sanchez del Rio was canonized a saint on October 16, 2016 by Pope Francis.

Sealed for Battle

The oil that we are anointed with at Baptism and again at Confirmation is a sign of a seal. In ancient Rome, soldiers were marked with the seal of their leader. The seal showed two things: 1) The soldiers belonged to their leader 2) the soldiers would follow their leader. They've become students or disciples. When the priest/bishop, who is Christ's representative, marks us with Christ seal – the Cross – we become bound to Christ's teachings, even onto death.

Getting Equipped

A good leader always equips his men with the proper tools to win battles. In Confirmation, Christ equips us with the gift of wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge and fear of the Lord (reverence for God). The ultimate spiritual nutrition we receive is Christ's body and blood made present in the Eucharist at every Mass. Mass is our weekly training session where we are reminded what is at stake and we are refueled by God's word and Christ's body and blood.

Not a Choice for Everyone

Now here's the challenging bit. Once we receive the seal of Confirmation, we have two choices. We can hang up our boots and tools and allow them to collect dust. Or we can "fight the good fight" on the frontlines, like St. Jose, the recent Sri Lankan saints, the apostles and countless men, women and children throughout the centuries who stayed faithful to their leader, Jesus Christ.
