Why Giving up Chocolate is Missing the Point of Lent

One of my most recent hobbies has been to fix and build and computers. For building computers is like Lego for kids. Lego indeed, very expensive Lego.

Admittedly, I think it's safe to say this seemingly innocent hobby has become an attachment for me. I often feel restless unless I get a system working perfectly and if it doesn't turn out I get angry.

This past week I experienced an episode of frustration and anger that was a clear sign that I should give this hobby up for Lent, if not permanently. To make a long story short, I have been working on a system for two weeks. A major component kept malfunctioning and I had to order replacements. I installed the replacement and the computer wouldn't even turn on.

I was infuriated to say the least. I felt like I wasted so much time and energy on something so superficial.

Why is the Bible Obsessed with Sacrifice?

One of the side effects of Original Sin is our tendency to adopt attachments that give us momentary pleasure, but fall short of giving us a sense of fulfilment. At worst these habits end up hurting us, our loved ones, and our relationship with God.

This is the significance of animal sacrifice in the Old Testament. The entire Old Testament presents a story of a people who constantly turn away from God and constantly need their hearts reconverted. In today's first reading, Abraham sacrifices a ram in thanksgiving for the life of his son. The Levitical laws command the Israelites to make a temple sacrifice of an unblemished lamb every year during Passover.

"But isn't scarifying animals a bit too much?," you might be thinking. Cattle were the livelihood of many families in the ancient world. They were a source of income and food for families. So to sacrifice expensive cattle was truly an act of sacrifice for households. The purpose of the sacrifice was to help the Israelites remember that their dependence does not lie in the material world, but in God. This is why the Passover – the remembrance of Israelite's liberation from Egypt – was accompanied by temple sacrifice. Sacrifice is a gesture of thanksgiving towards God.

What about sacrifice today?

I want to conclude by asking you: What are your attachments that can be offered up to God this Lent? Are you attached to your phone? Can you sacrifice social media or having your phone turned off when you're with your family? Can you sacrifice spending time on YouTube or playing video games for prayer in front of the Eucharist?

This Lent let's challenge each other to sacrifice the things that draw us away from God and replace them with actions that will draw us closer to Him.

CALL FOR CONSCIENCE CAMPAIGN


The Call for Conscience 2018 Campaign is underway. Cardinal Collins and bishops across Ontario are asking for an email address from every Catholic family in their community, with a goal of 100,000 email addresses collected by the end of February 2018. This information will be used locally by Cardinal Collins and trusted faith partners to communicate periodically (approximately 6-8 times each year) on issues of particular importance for the Catholic community.

The first campaign of 2018 is the Call for Conscience, inviting our elected Members of Provincial Parliament (MPP's) and those seeking office this June to increase funding/access to palliative care, to protect health care workers wishing to abstain from any involvement in euthanasia/assisted suicide and to protect faith based facilities from participation in euthanasia/assisted suicide. The work builds on a similar campaign in 2017.
