INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY <u>REFLECTION</u>

March 8 was International Women's Day — a day to recognize women's achievements and acknowledge the challenges they continue to face in the quest for gender equality. It is a day to renew our efforts in achieving gender equality – in Canada and around the world. The United Nations recognized 1975 as International Women's Year designating March 8 as International Women's Day. It has grown to become a global day of recognition of women's achievements and a call to action to support women's rights and advance gender equality.

Equality between women and men is enshrined in the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms* and the Government of Canada is committed to upholding gender equality in all sectors of Canadian society. We have made great strides in many areas, such as education and workforce participation. Nevertheless, challenges remain. One such challenge is the use of **inclusive language** or lack thereof.

Language reflects and shapes the way we see the world. Language is an important communication tool which expresses reality and lived experience. It is constantly evolving in response to technological and social developments and adjusting to cultural understandings.

"Man" is an example of a word which is now acquiring a more narrow meaning. It was commonly understood to have both a generic meaning (a human being of either sex) and a specific meaning (a male person). At the present, the word "male" is being used more and more with reference to the male person and less as a generic term.

For many the continued use of the word to mean male and female is alienating because women are not visibly included, as men are, in a word to describe the whole of humanity. Thus the use of inclusive language indicates care is being taken to ensure that words reflect our belief in the equality of men and women.

Using inclusive language is one way of emphasizing the Church's responsibility to take a stand one of the widespread forms of discrimination found in our society. As sensitivity to the inclusion of women grows, there should be a corresponding increase in awareness of the need to include all regardless of race, gender creed, age or ability.
