YES, YOU CAN READ THE BIBLE!

Have you ever tried reading the Bible? How did it go? Two common answers to this question are: "Yes, but I got bored" Or "Yes, but it was confusing." I have no doubt that many of you reading this would have given the same answers. I don't blame you for your responses. Like in any discipline, when it comes to reading the Bible a foundation needs to be set. Before learning a new language, you have to learn the alphabet and grammatical rules of that language. Trying to learn a new language without the foundational principles is impossible. Having said this let's look at two foundational principles for reading the Bible.

1. Don't Open and Point

The biggest mistake you can make is to open the Bible to a random page and start reading with the hopes of finding some secret spiritual truth. The writers of the Bible were not intending for their writings to be cryptic. Their goal was to write with intent and clarity for their respective audience. Before reading a book in the Bible I encourage you to find out the following: 1) what is the genre? Are you reading poetry, prophecy, biography, historical narrative, legal texts, letters, or apocalyptic literature. 2) Who is the intended audience? Knowing the intended audience will help you better understand key words or phrases. Is the intended audience pagan, Jewish, non-Jewish Christians, etc. The Bible is a library of books of different genres. Many modern study Bibles have brief articles written before each book to help readers navigate through them. My favourite is the Ignatius Catholic Study Bible.

2. Read the Bible in Light of Jesus

Before the two major parts of the Bible were titled the Old and New Testament they were referred to as the Old and New Covenant.

Jesus is the New Covenant, or God's newest and final promise to humanity. He is the fulfilment of the Old Covenant prophecies. In today's Gospel, Luke presents the resurrected Jesus appearing before his disciples. The disciples are afraid and confused (Lk 24:37-38) until Jesus "opened their minds to understand the scriptures..." (v.45). The Old Testaments contains *types* for Jesus. For example, Abraham's first born son, Isaac, who Abraham almost sacrificed (cf.Gen 22:1-19) is a type for Jesus because Isaac preconfigured Christ's sacrifice. There are several *types* in the Old Testament that point to Jesus. My favourite one is the Ark of the Covenant that the Israelites carried the Commandments in.The Ark of the Old Covenant is the type for the Ark of the New Covenant, Mary, who carried in her the New Covenant, Jesus.

These two principles are by no means exhaustive, but they are a good starting point for getting more out your Bible.
