

HONORING MARY IN MAY

I have fond memories of my childhood celebrating the feast of the Blessed Virgin in a small town nestled in the hills of Abbruzzi. It was a time of festivity, of families coming together to celebrate the festa of the Madonna. The Blessed Virgin, "Madonna Dell'Elcina still holds a special place in the hearts of all the people from this region in Abbruzzi, so much so, that the people continue the tradition to celebrate her here in Canada each year.

The month of May is the "month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady," and it is the occasion for a "moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world [pay] to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance" (Paul VI: Encyclical on the Month of May, no. 1).

Mary holds a special place in the heart of many faithful. Throughout the centuries, Catholics have had the custom of paying special tribute to Mary by placing a crown on her head referred to as "The Crowing of Mary". Last Tuesday, at the evening Mass, many parishioners joined together to celebrate this special devotion to Mary. This devotion has a special spiritual significance – the gift of oneself. The offering of the crown represents that act of placing oneself under the guidance and protection of the Blessed Virgin that she may rule over our hearts.

There are many devotions to Mary but one special devotion is the family reciting the Rosary together. "The custom of the family recitation of the Holy Rosary is a most efficacious means. What a sweet sight - most pleasing to God - when, at eventide, the Christian home resounds with the frequent repetition of praises in honor of the High Queen of Heaven! Then the Rosary, recited in the family, assembled before the image of the Virgin, in an admirable union of hearts, the parents and their children, who come back from their daily work. It unites them piously with those absent and those dead. It links all more tightly in a sweet bond of love, with the most Holy Virgin, who, like a loving mother, in the circle of her children, will be there bestowing upon them an abundance of the gifts of concord and family peace
