OUR BURSARY FOR A FIRST NATIONS <u>STUDENT</u>

The Social Justice Committee has been raising funds for a bursary for a First Nations student at the University of Nipissing. Our commitment is for 3 years for a bursary of \$1,000.00 each year to be awarded to an Indigenous student to be chosen by the University.

There is an assumption that Indigenous students do not have costs involved in regards to attending university since they do not need to pay for tuition and books. This is actually a common misconception that Indigenous students receive free tuition and books.

Our government does support Indigenous students and provides funds for tuition and books. The funds are distributed to the various bands, and from there the indigenous students must apply to their band for funding to attend post secondary school.

Unfortunately there are limited funds and some students are denied. Also some bands provide some funding for books and accommodation and some only provide funding for tuition. The majority of indigenous students do have to cover their own accommodation expenses. The person in charge of Bursaries at Nipissing University has indicated that an increasing number of indigenous students coming to Nipissing have had to apply to OSAP because they did not receive funding from their band. This is mainly because the indigenous youth population is growing in Canada, and support funds that are distributed to the bands has not grown along with the population.

The student chosen by the Nipissing University to receive the bursary for 2017 is an Algonquin First Nations student in his second year in the Social Welfare and Social Development Program. His aim is to be finished by the spring of 2020 and to find work in the non-profit sector to help others reach their potential.

Education is one of the key recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission. The annual bursary is small but it shows a willingness to move forward to a better future.
