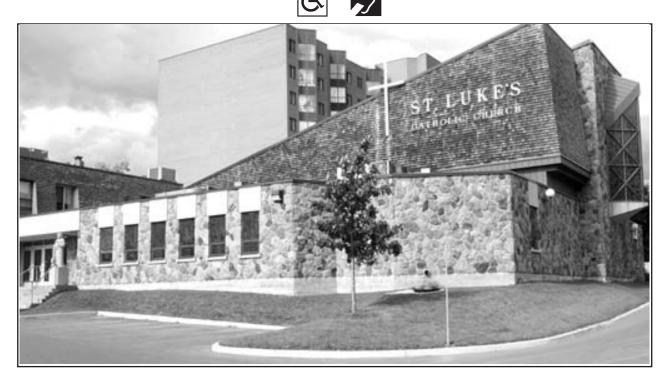



Janice is a retired school teacher. In her spare time Janice volunteers at the Good Shepherd Centre, an emergency shelter for adult men. She helps to provide meals to the many homeless who drop in. Janice gives of her time and energy and at the same time has made friends who share the same love and dedication to serve those less fortunate.

Albert drives people who have no transportation, to their doctor's appointments, to the bank to pay their bills, to their church, or to get groceries. A recipient of his generosity states, "He is very giving and kind, patient and concerned... always willing to help." Albert sees this as a means to help others. He is 75 years old, a retired bus driver.

James is 78 years old and on any given day you will find him buzzing around the community, off to visit the sick and dying in his job as a hospice volunteer. He has been helping patients for the past 10 years when he began volunteering to fill the void after his wife died. As a widower, he understands the loneliness that many of the sick and seniors face. He says, "When they give you a smile and laugh at your jokes, well, it's worth all the time you put into it."

This "Second half of life" is a point in life when we can quietly observe and reflect on the events, the circumstances and relationships that have filled our life and give thanks for the many gifts God has gifted us with. It is a time when we can nurture our spiritual relationship and spiritual growth. It is a time to reflect upon the meaning of who we have become, as a reflection of God's love.
