Christ is Risen, Alleluia!

"Do not be afraid, He has risen, just as he said." (Matt. 28:5-8)

Easter Sunday morning is a time for great rejoicing. Christ has defeated death and is the source of new life. On this greatest day of the year, all fasting and somber thoughts are banished.

St. John Chrysostom in his Paschal sermon wrote, "If anyone is devout and a lover of God, let them enjoy this beautiful and radiant festival. If anyone is a grateful servant, let them, rejoicing, enter into the joy of his Lord. If anyone has wearied themselves in fasting, let them now receive recompense. If anyone has labored from the first hour, let them today receive the just reward. If anyone has come at the third hour, with thanksgiving let them feast ... He has mercy upon the last and cares for the first; to the one He gives, and to the other He is gracious ... Let all partake of the feast of faith. Let all receive the riches of goodness. Let no one lament their poverty, for the universal kingdom has been revealed. Let no one mourn their transgressions, for pardon has dawned from the grave. Let no one fear death, for the Saviour's death has set us free." (Circa 400 AD)

Over the past seven months the Parish of St. Luke's have been richly blessed by the presence and the experience of the Catechumenate. In September, we welcomed a group of women and men into the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) process. These candidates felt called by God to explore and enhance their knowledge, understanding and appreciation of the Catholic Faith. The RCIA is not a program that begins and finishes. No, it is a process of one's faith journey. It is the unfolding of God's sacred plan for us; from here to eternity.

At the Easter Vigil we welcomed these men and women, into our parish community. The Catechumenate process recognizes that conversion to Jesus and membership in the Church is still a radical step. It demands courage to "die" to old ways. Old ideas and priorities are re-evaluated. Things that did not seem important at first take on new meaning. Its purpose, however, is conversion - a Journey of Mind, Heart and Spirit. And so we rejoice and congratulate our new members. In seeing the amazing faith that they have expressed, our own faith has been renewed and strengthened. We are deeply grateful for their commitment and passionate dedication over the past seven months. We offer them our thanks and our admiration, and we pray for them as they begin this new phase of their spiritual journey.

As St. John wrote, let all receive the riches of goodness; let no one lament, no one mourn, *but rejoice*. If we go into our hearts, to that place of repentance and love, Christ will meet us with the words, "Rejoice! Do not be afraid! I am with you always!" Happy Easter! Antoinette
