

Net Worth

Recently, our 10-year-old son Hewi has been searching the internet for the net worth of various individuals. From JK Rowling, to Bill Gates and Pope Francis he wants to know how much they are all worth. Just a few days ago, the inevitable question came from our 8-year-old son Caleb: 'Daddy, what is our net worth?' I smiled and responded: "Probably somewhere between Pope Francis and JK Rowling." At their age I didn't have a clue what the term 'net worth' meant yet today they are keenly aware of it.

I asked my son Hewi if he desired to have a high net worth and he responded yes so I asked him why. He told me he wanted a high net worth so he could help the poor. I told him that he would have to work pretty hard because 80% of the world's population or 6 billion people live on about \$10 a day or less so if he wanted to give these 6 billion people just one day off, he would have to save approximately 60 billion dollars.

Our discussion brought to light to a misconception prevalent in our world that justifies the accumulation of wealth as long as something good eventually comes from it. This is witnessed by such campaigns as the Giving Pledge, an organization whose stated goal is to inspire the wealthy to give at least half of their net worth to philanthropy, either during their lifetime or upon their death.

Christian ethics informs us that the end can never justify the means, so the selfish hoarding of the earth's resources is never justified by their eventual distribution. This is echoed in the Gospel of Luke where Jesus says: 'Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions, and give alms. Make purses for yourselves that do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.'

One only has to put themselves in the Creator's shoes and it becomes evident you would want your creation shared as equally as possible at all times and the fallacy of wealth accumulation is further undermined when examined in relative terms for even if a person were to become the world's wealthiest person and owned all the earth's resources, relatively they would still be very poor as they would own the resources of just 1 of the estimated 10 000 000 000 000 000 000 000 000 planets in the universe. Therefore, let us constantly beg God for the grace to see the net worth of a small circle of bread and to continually grow in our appreciation of its inestimable value and the same inestimable value of all our neighbours in the world.

- 11. Holy water fonts will be empty.
- 12. Most paper resources are not available.
- 13. You are welcome to contact the Parish office on weekdays to purchase Missals, Mass Cards or if you require Holy Water refills.
- 14. Most areas of the parish building are now considered **RESTRICTED**, including the Tabernacle, the hall, our washrooms, the kitchen and the north entrance. Please do not enter these areas.
- 15. When mass is over we ask that you leave the building immediately to permit sanitizing for the next mass.
- 16. Please follow the directions of our ushers and volunteers at all times. Thank you for your patience.
- 17. Due to limited spacing, please only attend mass once each weekend.
