

Points to Consider Before Coming to Weekend Mass

- 1. Our washrooms are closed.
- 2. Masks or face coverings are now mandatory.
- 3. Sanitizer is required when entering the Parish. You are welcome to use your own sanitizer but please apply it in front of our greeters.
- An usher will escort you to the next available seat. 4.
- 5. Please stay in your seat once seated except for communion.
- Please no singing during mass. 6.
- Communion is still being distributed in the hand only. 7.
- There will be no collection during mass. Offerings may 8. be left in the baskets in the narthex or you can donate on-line or drop off in the mailbox at the north doors.
- 9. No handshakes during the sign of peace.
- 10. No touching of statues.
- 11. Holy water fonts will be empty.
- 12. Bulletins are now available but are not permitted in the sanctuary. Please pick up a copy on your way out.
- 13. You are welcome to contact the Parish office on weekdays to purchase Missals, Mass Cards or if you require Holy Water refills.
- 14. Most areas of the parish building remain closed including the hall, our washrooms, the kitchen and the north entrance. Please do not enter any of these areas without permission.
- 15. When mass is over we ask that you leave the building immediately to permit sanitizing for the next mass.
- 16. Please follow the directions of our ushers and volunteers at all times. Thank you for your patience.
- 17. Due to limited spacing, please only attend mass once each weekend.
- 18. If you are not feeling well, please do not come to the parish.

MASKS

Masks or face coverings are mandatory inside all public places in York Region. Upon entering the parish building, please wear a mask or face covering and wear it correctly covering your mouth, nose and chin for the duration of time you are in the parish.
