

LENT

This Wednesday ushers in the beginning of the Lenten invitation to yet again change our hearts and fall deeper in love with God and the things of God. The deeper we fall in love with God the more we cannot help but love and care about what God loves and cares about. What does God love? Us. "*Love one another even as I have loved you*" (John 13:34). God loves us deeply and invites our response - love one another – and the environment (climate change adversely affects current and future generations.)

The traditional Lenten Practices of **prayer**, **fasting** and **almsgiving** have much wisdom. Lent can be a time to start new patterns and then continue them through-out the year. Usually we give up something but we could also add something to our daily lives during Lent – extra **prayer** time or service (this could be as simple as being more attentive to someone who feels isolated or giving someone a ride.) We could **pray** for the grace to focus on the common good before our personal needs. We could **pray** that we and the elected leaders of the world will address the challenge of climate change and our over-dependence on fossil fuels.

One temptation is to believe that we are powerless to do anything. We could **fast** from thinking we have no power to change the world or that we have to do it all before it makes a difference. We could **fast** as much as possible from things that pollute. We could add statements by the Pope or Bishops about Climate Change and other issues to our reading list (copies are available in our Library).

We might increase our **almsgiving.** We could expand our horizons to welcome everyone in the circle of our love so that no one is left out. This could include valuing and learning from those of other denominations and faith traditions. (Lenten Series, Interfaith events). We could increase our **almsgiving** through Share Life.

Lent is a personal journey with God but it is also a communal journey. If we are to put into practice the vision of Jesus of bringing about the Reign of God, we can only do it together as a community of faith.


