

Little things like courtesy and consideration, remembering and listening do mean a lot in human relationships. Our real worth lies in who we are to one another.

The Widow's Offering

Every year, the same ritual took place in the temple. The high priest entered the Holy of Holies (the most sacred part of the temple) and offered sacrifice on behalf of the people for the sins that were committed during the course of that entire year. This feast was so revered that a rope was tied around the ankle of the high priest before he entered the sacred space. This is because the high priest was the only one allowed to enter the Holy of Holies; if he died while he was in there, the people outside needed a way to retrieve his corpse. The irony is that although the high priest entered into the holiest place on Earth, he could never fully enter into God's presence — a part of him always stayed tied to the material world. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews uses this annual ritual to help people understand the reality of Christ's sacrifice. Jesus entered the real Holy of Holies — heaven — and made atonement for our sins. He offers us an invitation to receive this gift.

Unfortunately, we are often still attached to material things. Like ropes tied around our ankles, we enter into a relationship with Jesus with a lingering connection to security — or at least what we consider to be security. We don't give everything in our life to Christ, just in case things don't go as we planned. In the first reading and in the Gospel, we find the witness of two widows who hold nothing back from God. The first gives Elijah, a man she knows to be a prophet of God, the rest of her food. Trusting his word that God will provide, she takes a risk and let's go; and her reward is abundant. The widow in the Gospel is singled out by Jesus for her incredible faith. Her small gift reflected her "all in" attitude toward a relationship with God. She could see beyond the current moment and into eternity.

This week challenges us to ask what we are hanging onto in our relationship with God. To fully embrace the gift that Jesus has for us, we need to let go and fully trust that His salvation is all we need to be satisfied. When we take the rope off our ankle, we find that God has everything we need. In Him, our lives are secure.

Reflect: The poor widow in the Gospel offers not from her surplus, but from her poverty. Where might you lack talent, time, or treasure but still give a meaningful offering to the Lord?

<u>Challenge:</u> Detachment comes through recognizing that God alone satisfies the desires of our heart. No clothing, relationship, grade point average, job, social status, trophy, or wealth can grant our lives true or lasting peace. Practice detachment this week by letting go of something that brings you worldly comfort — choose to wear only simple outfits, fast from a meal, refrain from boasting about a good grade, or give a little more than usual in this Sunday's collection. Make it an offering to the Lord, that from your poverty you might grow in faith.
