Another Lent has dawned and fresh beginnings are at hand. With it, a new season of prayer, penance and fasting will begin in the church and in our homes. When asked what we are giving up for Lent, let it be any self-serving activities that prevent us from getting back to the things we have been neglecting.

During lent we are encouraged to re-commit ourselves to the practice of *prayer*, *fasting and almsgiving*. **Prayer** can take many forms, like going to mass more frequently, reading the scriptures daily, reciting the rosary or becoming part of a prayer group. **Fasting**, one of the core disciplines of Christianity is a traditional way of acknowledging one's dependence on God. If it does nothing else, it reminds us that while one third of the world is suffering from over consumption, the other two thirds are dying from hunger and malnutrition. **Almsgiving** to charitable causes can bring freedom and a fresh start to the poorest of people.

Lent is a time for drawing closer to God. Through repentance, conversion and a change of heart let us prepare ourselves spiritually for the feast of Easter.

1st Sunday of Lent

It's easy to "feel" God is with us when life is going our way. Do we feel God's presence or trust in His promise, though, when things aren't going so well – when we feel isolated, or alone, or outnumbered? It's when it is most difficult to "find" God that we must remember how close He constantly is and promises to remain. Evil looks for those "entry points" of doubt and fear to "set up shop" in our heart and make us question the very things we know to be true and divide us from our Sisters & Brothers in Christ.

Moses had to repeatedly remind those who had been wandering for 40 years that God rescued them before and would remain faithful in His promise. The psalm reminds us that trouble accompanies life, suffering cannot be avoided, and asking God to be with us in it all is not only allowed but encouraged. Saint Paul reminds the Christians in Rome – and all of us, really – that God is near, and those who confess to know Him and profess He is Lord will be saved!

The Gospel reminds us, too, that even Christ was not free of suffering or temptation. God did not even spare His only Son of hardship. It is when we are alone in the spiritual deserts of life that we must have the faith and strength to believe God is still with us and, in time, we will hear His voice, once again.

Reflect:

What are some temptations in your day that you may be allowing sin to enter in because of? (For example, does boredom tempt you to sin? Then when do you allow boredom into your day and what can you have on hand to do when you are bored that will lead you toward Christ instead of away from Him?)

Challenge:

When Jesus was tempted, He turned to Scripture. During this week, read the readings for daily Mass each morning (which you can find easily on usccb.com) and note one phrase to reflect on during the day, especially in the face of temptation.
