4th Sunday of Lent

"This hurts me more than it hurts you" is more than a parenting cliché uttered after delivering a just punishment; it is a deep spiritual truth about our Father in heaven. Sin does not just break a rule, it breaks a relationship, and it goes against realty. Sin does not keep God from loving us, but it does destroy our ability and capacity to receive and experience God's love.

The first reading is a cause for celebration in the Book of Joshua. Israel is God's child and their 40-year punishment has finally drawn to a close. It's a new day and the Father is happy to begin a new chapter with His offspring. In the same way we see the Prodigal Son's father welcoming him home, we see the Lord welcome Israel. It is in this same way that we are reconciled with God, who looks at us as a new creation. Though we are sinners, God views us as saints in the making. God's mercy is unyielding and constant and His invitation to love and be loved by Him is eternal. This is why we "taste and see the goodness of the Lord" at every single Mass and in His sacramental Church.

Reflect:

Why do you think the father held a celebration for the younger son rather than punish him? What would you have done?

Challenge:

Take ten minutes every night to reflect on the areas of that day you chose to walk away from God and the areas where you've failed to thank God. You may choose to write this down in a journal. Share some of their areas of thankfulness and struggles with a close friend and ask for their prayers.


