#### **SCAPEGOATING**

A few years ago, I was troubled by a friend who experienced being a scapegoat. He reacted truthfully about a contentious social issue, but was rejected by his community for doing so and was forced to resign from his position. Through his dismissal, a greater peace resulted between the two opposing sides in the conflict.

According to Rene Girard, a French historian, scapegoating is nothing new and can be found in the beginnings of the bible with the first murder of Abel. He claims that our creaturely, communal nature means that our desires are mimetic or copied from each other. Since we all end up desiring the same things, conflict eventually ensues, as resources are limited. Such conflict would lead to the eventual destruction of the community so a scapegoat mechanism has evolved to prevent the communities' mutual destruction. Behind the mechanism is the great Accuser or Satan who works to perpetuate the scapegoat mechanism to sustain his earthly kingdom.

Scapegoating happens in all aspects of society and even with the Blue Jays this season as manager Charlie Montoyo was fired for the team's poor performance. It is perplexing how the scapegoat mechanism works so well given how unjust it is. The reason it continues to work is because all scapegoats hold some guilt. My friend was not perfect, Charlie Montoyo made mistakes, instances of impropriety can always be found within any persecuted minority group etc. This was not the case for one particular scapegoat in human history, Jesus. Jesus was innocent and his crucifixion fully revealed to society the workings and the injustices of the scapegoat mechanism as the Centurion declares: 'Certainly this man was innocent.'

Caiaphas reveals what we all have inherited in our broken human nature: 'That it is better that one should die for the people than the whole nation be destroyed'. In acknowledging this though, we see our own implicit cooperation in Jesus' death and our own collective guilt. Consequently, we can never participate in the scapegoat mechanism quite the same way again: 'For let he who is without sin cast the first stone'. This awareness is the first step towards true reconciliation with God and neighbour and our living out the Kingdom of God as we witness Zacchaeus doing in the Gospel this weekend rising above the mob's collective pursuit of limited wealth to imitate Jesus' model of unlimited love.

Aware of this tendency to scapegoat everybody and anybody including ourselves, we are invited instead to unite ourselves with what many consider the greatest act in human history after Christ's Passion, Mary's silence at the foot of the cross. Where an innocent mother loves an innocent Son to the very end. John Humphries.
