First Aid

"Your wound shall be quickly healed"

If you've ever witnessed an accident or found yourself in a situation where someone needed emergency medical attention, then you know how stressful it can be. As people wait for an ambulance to arrive, other people desperately begin searching for a doctor or nurse or anyone with medical or emergency training. If viewed through this lens of urgency, action, and wisdom, this week's readings have a similar theme.

As Christians, we are <u>called</u> to act, to serve, and to help the Lord in His work of salvation here on Earth. To extend the analogy, if Christ is the divine surgeon in the E.R. of the sanctuary and confessional, we who know Him and follow Him are like His paramedics. We **help bring the sick to the physician**. We aren't supposed to hide our light but to shine brightly, as the Gospel challenges us. God's children must be prepared to act and to serve in tangible ways, ways that will save lives (and souls), as we see in Isaiah's admonition. If we are humble enough to trust in God's wisdom and power — the first aid training we have received — we will be prepared to **share His knowledge and His truth with the souls dying for it**, spiritually.

If we see the culture for where it really is — a culture of darkness and increasing hopelessness — there will be a sense of urgency for us to respond. Souls are perishing and the modern Christian must be prepared to become small (in humility) but not act small (with false humility or timidity). God wants us to act and to do so in a way that unleashes His power and brings Him all the glory.

Reflect: (on 1 or more of the following) (1) Before we can bring others to health, we must be healthy ourselves. Is there anything from your past that has created a wound? Has it been healed? If not, how can you open yourself up to God's healing power?; (2) Have you ever brought someone to Christ who needed healing? How did that experience change you?; or (3) How is God calling you to bring others to Him (or bring Him to others)? Is there a kind of service that you feel a pull towards?

Challenge of the Week: One way that we can serve others and bring them closer to Christ is to be hospitable. Meeting someone's needs by sacrificing yourself, belongings, or time are all things that Jesus did while walking on this Earth. This week, be hospitable. Invite a friend to your home and make them dinner. Tutor that guy in your math class who is having trouble with the particular lesson you are learning. Not only invite someone to Alpha, but join and accompany them in the journey. Service and sacrifice for others always glorifies God.
