He is telling us that if we keep ourselves open to the Spirit of God's love, then what we say and do must express what is deep in our hearts. Christ wants us to purify our intentions and move away from external appearances and observances. It is not enough to pay lip service to the commandments. The real standard is whether our motives are sincere. We might fool some with a good and charitable act, but never God or our conscience.

Repent The Kingdom Is Near

I was recently angry with my eldest son. I needed the computer to help my younger son with his homework and my eldest was reading a digital book, which he was really enjoying and didn't want to give it up. I asked him twice and when he did not respond, I screamed at him and told him to give it to me now.

Immediately after, I felt bad about screaming at him and especially in such short fashion. I thought to myself that I will need to go to confession to confess the sin I had just committed. It won't be the first time as Fr. Mark and Fr. Wen are very familiar with my confessing the sin of anger.

The more I reflected on it though, the more I realized I need to do more than simply confess my sin as it keeps reoccurring. I need to fundamentally change my way of thinking and being with my family, I need what Jesus calls, metanoia. Metanoia is the combination of 2 Greek words meta and noia. Meta means to change and noia means thinking. So, I need to fundamentally change my way of thinking because it keeps resulting in anger.

The first words of Jesus' public ministry in Mark and Matthew's Gospels are; "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." The Greek word for repent is metanoia so Jesus is proclaiming that we need to change our way of thinking and enter into a new way of being, rooted in God. This new way of being begins with our Baptism when our connection to the sinful ways of Adam are severed and we are grafted to the New Adam and Tree of Life, Jesus.

If I want to truly change, I need to identify the sin that I keep committing and bring it into the light so God's love, healing and wisdom may shine upon it. Once revealed and confessed I need to renounce the sin in the name of Jesus asking God to heal and make me whole, something I am incapable of doing on my own.

I can also ask God to help deliver me from future temptations to fall into the sin of anger and to strengthen me that in future interactions I will remain calm and compassionate with the help of God's grace.

I also need to ask my son and my family for forgiveness and to pray for me. To admit to them I have a problem with anger and need their help and prayers. Finally, I turn to my Church family and ask them for forgiveness and prayers as my sin affects them too, the Body of which I am an integral part.

I have faith that with all these helps in place I will experience the metanoia that Jesus' is inviting me to and I will slowly become more like our Heavenly Father, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. John Humphries.
