#### Reflecting Back to See Ahead

Recently I was on retreat at the Manresa Jesuit Spiritual Renewal Centre in Pickering. It was a wonderful three days full of peace and joy. Father John Sullivan from St. John's Newfoundland led the retreat and shared with us some of the difficulties his diocese is experiencing and how his former parish was amalgamated with two others. Prior to the amalgamation, his parishioners were having a hard time accepting the loss of their parish and there was a mix of fear and desolation. The primary message he tried to convey to them was that no matter how dire the situation may appear there is no need to fear for God's nature is to give Life and will always do so. As it turns out the transition has gone extremely well and the parish is thriving.

In our own lives, this can often be the case where we see turmoil in our families and in the world and we wonder: 'Where is God?' It does not take much reflection to see that God is in the midst of it all. One exercise that the Jesuits recommend to become aware of God's constant presence is the Examen. Through the Examen a person reviews the past 24 hours to see where God has been working. It always amazes me when I pray the Examen to see just how active God has been in my day in so many small and significant ways. It is literally an embarrassment of riches.

The more we become aware of the presence of God, the more we trust the Kingdom is near. It also helps us to recognize the times when we have been afraid and ask God for healing and courage in future situations.

As we see in our Gospel this weekend we are called to go to the lost sheep of the house of Israel to cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers and cast out demons proclaiming the good news that the Kingdom has come near. Two thousand years later a similar need still exists for faith and healing in our world. What a wonderful invitation, being called to do the work of Christ! How must God love us that he entrusts his mission and the work of his Son with us? It is enough to make our hearts sing with joy and gratitude.

So let us share the Good News with all we ecounter: 'Jesus is alive and has appeared to Simon'. Let us make our hearts, our homes, our workplaces and our churches Tabernacles of eternal love where people encounter the Peace the world cannot give. In addition, let us not forget to Examen the previous day to see God's presence to fuel the day ahead anticipating with excitement where we will encounter God in the people, places and serendipity of the day and remember that Jesus is with us always, to the end of the age.




#### St. Luke's Annual Picnic
