

<u>Prophets and Losses</u> "Whoever receives you receives me."

How far are you willing to go for God? What limits have you put on following Him? Perhaps you will go wherever He calls you to go like becoming a missionary in a foreign land or entering the seminary/convent. Maybe you've drawn a line in the sand with God by telling Him you'll do "this but NOT this (like many do with this" priesthood/religious life). Maybe you'll follow God as long as it doesn't mean you have to be too uncomfortable. Perhaps a life in ministry would be more appealing if there was more profit in it.

This week's readings remind us that God is more concerned with heaven than Earth, with eternity than the temporary, and with prophets over profits.

Jesus is clear in the Gospel: don't let anything come between you and Him. Love God above anything, and everything will work out. Will it be comfortable? No, there will be crosses (and losses) involved, but you will be happy, and you will be saved. Saint Paul tells us in the second reading that our Baptism doesn't buy us earthly riches but, rather, opens the door to heavenly glory. If you are with God, you'll be taken care of as we saw with His prophet Elisha in the first reading. Not only that, countless people will be blessed by your holy example. The prophets didn't seek a title, nor did they set out for glory; they were merely obedient (unto death) and because of their obedience, they are still revered and God's words (through them) are still read today. God invests in us and sees prophets in the long run.

Reflect:

What part of your life has God been calling you to surrender to Him? Why are you hesitant?

Challenge of the Week:

If you say you don't have time for prayer, make time. Every day this week, wake up an hour earlier and start your day right. Take a shower, eat a nice breakfast, tidy up your room, and spend 15 or 30 minutes in prayer. I'm confident Christ will reward your effort!
