

Mercy and Salvation: What Is the Connection?

In todays Gospel readings we learn about the importance of forgiveness, and the gravity of the sin in failing to be forgiving. It is a legitimate question to ask when we ought to be merciful, and to what extent. Is there any wrongdoing, no sin or injustice committed against oneself or another, that cannot be forgiven? Our Lord tells us that no sin that He cannot forgive exists. That part is easy to understand. What is difficult to grasp, let alone live out, is how us mere mortals are supposed to be so merciful. By being called to imitate the life of our Lord we are obligated to follow his example. This includes forgiving those things we think are unforgivable, those things that bring anger and disruption to our hearts. Such a grace often does not come overnight (although, through God, anything is possible). How do we grow in this kind of mercy that transcends the natural world? Learning to forgive for less important things is a good start (e.g. moving past grudges). When wrongdoings are committed against oneself, learning to forgive instinctively, rather than responding vengefully or spitefully is also a good habit to practice. Paying attention to instances or relationships in our lives where we can be more merciful is crucial to discerning where we can be more merciful in our lives. A few important notes must be made, however. Forgiveness does not entail the permitting of wrongdoing. One can both forgive someone for damaging their property, for instance, while simultaneously receiving compensation for the damages. Justice and forgiveness are compatible, but there may be times when the former is unobtainable. Indeed, this is when forgiveness can be most difficult. This leads to my second note: the most important thing one can do to grow in forgiveness, especially in areas where it is most needed, is prayer and the sacraments. If we can be as merciful as the Lord only by imitating him, and receiving His grace is the only way we can become like God, then prayer and sacraments are necessary in virtue of being the mediums through which we grow to be like Christ. The Church's sacraments and our prayers are indispensable if we are to become like God Himself. Lastly, it is important to note what the Gospel says about those who fail to show mercy to others, especially if mercy has been shown to oneself. We are to pay back the debts of our wrongdoing if we are not to forgive the wrongdoings of others. But, so what? What if you're someone that does not do wrong things often? To think in such a way misses the point entirely. Each and every one of us humans are sinners, and our sin permeates our nature quite deeply to the extent that we often times aren't even aware of it. If we are forgiven by our Father in heaven for wrongdoings that we often don't intend, or even recognize as wrongdoings, then ought we not do the same for others? If we are forgiven for all our sins, ought we not try and be just as merciful towards others? Indeed, how grand an act of love such mercy truly is!


