

In today's gospel we are told that Christ spoke with authority and conviction; he was never a dictator, yet because he spoke with authority and conviction, he was nailed to the cross. The effects of His preaching were staggering because he spoke from the heart with enthusiasm for the truth. As a leader Jesus had people spellbound and challenged to the core of their being by the compelling power of what he was saying. When he spoke, everyone detected a ring of truth in his every word. They sensed that somehow or other he was different; this was the word of God. Jesus speaks to us on every aspect of human life – and he does not offer what he has to say as a personal opinion, or a studied conclusion, but as rooted in reality and truth. Jesus makes it clear that he is the sole voice of God in the world, speaking the final word from God the Father. The word of God will always challenge us to the depth of our being. Today it is asking us how honest and authentic we really are as we face the problems of living the Christian message amid a questioning world. If we follow it and live it we are speaking with authority in our own right and pointing people to God.

#### **Harden Not Your Hearts**

This is my first week back from my parental leave and as I reflect on the past couple months, during the seasons of Advent and Christmas I'm amazed by God's plan and how it compared to my own expectations and hopes. How was your Advent and Christmas seasons? Did it turn out how you hoped? How is your life today? Is it how you planned it would be?

As we go about our lives, try to worship God daily, and weekly during Sunday Mass, our Catholic faith, at times can seem predictable, with a certain rhythm to it; we have specific ways of praying, worshiping and going about the "Catholic" life. This can sometimes translate to how we view and approach God. We can see God as predictable, boring and ordinary.

The Church in its wisdom tells us that's not true. Today we see in the readings God is always doing something new, something unpredictable, calling us to preparing our hearts for something greater and exciting.

In the first reading, Moses tells of a new prophet, a mouthpiece of God, speaking what God bids. St. Paul in the seconding reading speaks of how God is calling certain men and women in Holy Orders in a new way. In the Gospel, people respond to Jesus by saying "What's is this? A new teaching – with authority!"

We see that through history God is calling each of us in new ways, not just in different ways, but His way, His path and plan for each of us and all of us. God is the one that sees and knows all. He is the author of life and authority to empower others with His authority.

My own Advent and Christmas season was wonderful, challenging and unexpected in many ways. When I open my heart, soften it to the teachings of the Church and promptings from God, I see a new and exciting way and life; one that is unpredictable and beyond my imagination. During this season of Ordinary Time, this time of growth, what is the Church guiding us to, what is God calling us to?

I thank God for the Church, for the men and women who say "yes" to His call through Holy Orders and for this season of Ordinary Time, inviting us to see His new ways for us and to grow closer to our heavenly Father.

#### **Indigenous Reconciliation Fund Update**

On December 12, 2023, the Archdiocese of Toronto announced the first phase of funding as part of our \$6 million commitment to the Indigenous Reconciliation Fund (IRF). Through the tremendous generosity of parishioners throughout the archdiocese, including our own parish, more than \$2.7 million has been directed through the IRF to organizations and projects committed to promoting healing and reconciliation for communities and families.

Another recipient of funds is: **Wigwamen Terrace** located in Toronto that will receive \$475,000 over five years allowing the organization to hire additional support staff in order to provide their elderly residents with assistance with navigating technology, accessing mental health services and maintaining connections to Indigenous cultural and spiritual communities and resources


