Surprised by Birthday Joy

A few weeks back my birthday fell on a Sunday and I was treated to one of the greatest gifts I have ever received. At the end of the 12:15 Mass the choir director Greg Benoit led the entire congregation in singing me 'Happy Birthday'. I was overwhelmed by the gesture and hearing the congregation sing with such love my heart was filled with immense happiness and joy. I don't know if I have ever felt so elated in my entire life.

The joy was so intense I experienced a sense of pain at receiving so much love. In my deepest thoughts I was thinking I'm not worthy of receiving so much love from these people, most of whom I've done nothing for.

It's interesting that just the week before this occurred, we saw Jesus commencing his public ministry and asking the people to repent and believe the good news. I've often thought of repentance meaning I need to change my behaviour and try to be a better person but perhaps it is more important to change my way of thinking and receiving the grace of God. To pray for the assistance to better receive the unconditional love of God and neighbour. This is why the sacrament of confession is so vital as there is no better means with which to open our spiritual arteries to the flow of God's love and to clear the blockages only God can clear.

The greatest blockage of our spiritual arteries is pride. We think by our own means we can somehow earn the acceptance of our neighbours and God. This is impossible and is not our fault as we are fundamentally broken due to the effects of original sin. It is only through Christ's salvific act that we are brought back into right relationship with God. Therefore, we have nothing to be self-loathing about because our free will was skewed from the beginning. Anything good we manifest is thanks to our Baptism and incorporation into the Body of Christ. At the same time, we have nothing to take pride in as all our good actions are the result of Holy Spirit animating us.

I find this truly liberating. One of my greatest challenges is self-regret but realizing I was bankrupt to begin with and anything good I do is on account of God's grace frees me from the judgement of neighbour and self. For if I am judged I am judged on brokeness or grace, not on what I have solitarily made myself to be. Therefore, I trust in God and in God alone and this is the essence of faith.

As St. Thérèse of Lisieux so aptly describes we must remain small and docile in the loving arms of Jesus: "The elevator which must raise me to heaven is Your arms O Jesus! And for this I had no need to grow up, but rather I had to remain little and become this more and more. O my God, You surpassed all my expectation. I want only to sing to Your mercies."
