

The Transfiguration is not just a tale of long ago but also an event of significance. Jesus knew that the apostles would not be able to cope with his death and disgrace on Good Friday. What they had seen and heard on the mountain was a spiritual boost to arm them against the horror of his passion and help them walk towards Jerusalem in his company. His Transfiguration was something that would strengthen their faith for those dark days on the rocky road to Calvary. On our own pilgrim journey, we come to realize that magic moments of great light, or peak experiences are rare. However, we can all recall treasured happenings that had a transforming influence on our lives – little things that tipped the balance, turned sadness into joy, made us feel valued, restored our faith in humanity or gave us the strength to persevere and stay on the right road. It may have been nothing more than a smile, a word of praise for our work, or the words "I love you", but at the time, it made the difference and everything fell into place. When our lives are in the valley of darkness, precious memories of golden moments can be the tonic that sees us through our time of suffering.

Dreaming to the Max

This weekend in the scriptures, we encounter one of my favourite readings, the Transfiguration. Whenever I sit with this passage in prayer, it never fails to be fertile ground. It is the climax of Jesus' public ministry and self-revelation as the disciples get a glimpse of his hidden identity. An experience that would carry them through future difficulties.

Like Peter, James and John God is constantly giving each of us divine glimpses of his hidden identity and at times I find the veil between us becoming shockingly thin. More and more I find myself echoing Peter's timeless words: "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here." Whenever I enter St. Luke's and experience the peace the world cannot give, I ask myself: 'what would I do without my faith?' What a blessing it is to gather each Sunday with my brothers and sisters and receive the Eucharist. I can fully appreciate Peter's desire to remain on the mountaintop for I feel the same way. It is hard for me to leave the church, much to the chagrin of my family who frequently lament: "Dad, do you need to talk so much?"

God gives so much but recently I have been reflecting on whether my faith correlates with God's providence. Are my dreams big enough? As Fr. James Mallon asks in his book Divine Renovation, 'do I believe that when I stare at my paltry loaves and fish and hear the Lord speak in my heart, "You give them something to eat," he will multiply the little I have?'

Jesus tells us in John 14: 12: 'Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it.' How scandalous Jesus words are, not only can we can match his works but do even greater things. Is this the faith I have?

In Jesus words I hear an invitation to remain on the mountaintop, invited to make God present and share his glory in all aspects of my life, as Peter says: 'we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty.'

US pastor Steven Furtick says that if our vision is not big enough that it scares the living daylights out of us, it may be insulting to God and Our Blessed Mother herself said, 'The Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.' What great things does God have planned for each of us this Lenten Season. How is God inviting us to transfigure the world through our own transfiguration. 'Rabbi, it is good for us to be here, enkindle in us the fire of your divine love. Amen."
