

Most of us can readily understand the disappointment of Martha and Mary when Jesus, who was their close friend, failed to show up at the sick bed & burial of their brother, Lazarus. Martha was annoyed at his absence and her reproach was straight from the heart when she said, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died.' Then, at the sight of Mary in tears, Jesus was troubled and wept. We watch Jesus consoling the sisters, then proceeding to their brother's grave, and giving orders for the stone covering the entrance to be rolled back. To their utter astonishment, he commands Lazarus to come out of the tomb.

This miracle is not just about Jesus performing the impossible by bringing a man back to physical life. The real focus is on belief. It is a "sign" of God's promise to raise up all who have died in Christ to everlasting life. Jesus wants to enter our hearts and bring his life-giving presence to those places of darkness, shame and even death. The good news is that he sets free those who are bound by sin and can bring back people to life no matter how long they have been dead to the things of the spirit. He is calling us to face the shadows, to come into the sunshine and walk in the fullness of life.

It's A Beautiful Day

I will never forget the Superbowl halftime show in February 2002. Widely considered the best half time performance of all time, it was just 5 short months after the September 11 tragedy and U2 was performing. The band started the show off with their upbeat hit It's a Beautiful Day and then things quieted as they sang MLK an elegy to Martin Luther King as the names of the 9/11 victims began rising on a screen behind the stage. As MLK slowly ended, they started what is considered their greatest song: Where the Streets Have No Name as Bono, the lead singer says a prayer saying: 'Oh Lord, open my lips, So I might show forth thy praise, Oh Lord, open my lips, So I might show forth thy praise' and then says 'America' before letting out a carnal scream that touched me and I'm sure the millions watching to the core.

I was so moved by Bono's scream because it so perfectly captured the situation. A tragedy of epic proportions, too complex to be dismissed as a simple matter of good vs. evil. Within the whole 9/11 event laid the eternal struggle, the war that has been raging since the fall.

Reading the Gospel from this weekend we see Jesus letting out a similar carnal scream 2000 years earlier as he witnesses the effects of sin on the lives of the people he loves so deeply. This occurs after Mary falls at his feet and says to him: "Lord, if you had been here my brother (Lazarus) would not have died." When Jesus saw her weeping and the Jews who had come with her weeping he became 'perturbed and deeply troubled" but the actual Greek word in this instance is more like Jesus snorted in anger. Likely he was angered and deeply distressed over the ramifications of sin on the world.

Perhaps in this moment Jesus is revealing God's great compassion for his people and answering the question that has been on every human being's mind for time eternal: 'God, do you really care?' Rather than simply dismiss their tears and tell them not to worry as he would soon raise Lazarus, Jesus enters into their suffering and stays there weeping with them. Consoling them and us that yes I do care and I'm about to show you just how much as he raises Lazarus, giving Life and confirming his own fate simultaneously.

At the end of U2's performance Bono opens his jacket to reveal an American flag knitted into the fabric, a beautifully symbolic gesture telling the American people that he cares and suffers with them. He was sure to open the left side of his jacket, the side with his heart just as Jesus heart was opened and pierced by the Roman soldier following his death. Let us do the same and open our hearts and lives to the needs of those around us this Lent and enter into their suffering with them knowing the answer, the Resurrection dwells and shines brightly within.


