

## **Mystagogy**

This Easter we prayerfully, warmly and joyfully welcomed many sisters and brothers into full communion with the Catholic Church. It was amazing to witness God work in their lives along this journey of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA). You may or may not know, the Easter Vigil Mass, where these individuals entered into the Catholic Church isn't the final phase of RCIA. We are now beginning the last of the formal RCIA phases called Mystagogy. If you're like me, several years ago before leading the RCIA program, this word, "Mystagogy" was new and strange and I didn't know what it meant. "Mystagogy" comes from the Greek word meaning "mystery"; so, this phase or period in our liturgical calendar is when we're "led through the mysteries".

In the early Church, the community used the fifty days from Easter to Pentecost to explain the mystery of the sacraments celebrated at the Easter Vigil Mass; Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. This is a period of accompaniment for new Catholics as they discover what it means to fully participate in the sacramental mysteries of the Church. The newly baptized are called "neophytes," from the Greek words meaning "new plant," because the faith has been newly planted in them. Even though their catechetical preparation has been completed, they still have much to learn about what it means to live as Catholic Christians.

During Mystagogy, new Catholics, the neophytes and those who have come into full communion with the Catholic Church, will reflect on their experience of conversion, gain a deeper understanding of God's word, the sacraments, and what their new commitment means for their life – they will be moving from learning to living. They are invited to participate more fully in the life of the parish so that they're faith may continue to be nourished and the faith of our community may be enhanced by the witness of its newest members. Neophytes will need the ongoing support of the community so that the faith newly planted in them can grow deep roots.

I encourage all of us to join the neophytes and those who have come into full communion with the Catholic Church in this period of mystagogy, to a deeper understanding of what it means to live not just as "Catholic Christians", but as disciples of Christ in his Church, to open our hearts and minds to more fully receive the abundance of graces God desires and seeks to give us in the sacraments. I lovingly challenge you, and myself, to desire and seek ongoing conversion in our lives, where we <u>accept</u> each moment as God's will for our life, give God <u>access</u> to our life and hearts, and allow God's work to <u>act</u> in us and through us daily. This Easter Season, may Jesus' resurrection, restore and transform our lives so that we can become a little more like him each day. - Alan Lee Hoy


