

Jesus offers us this beautifully striking image of the Vineyard when describing the intimate nature of the relationship between himself and his disciples. He is saving that his followers are to be so closely united with him as to share his ideals, attitudes and concerns. The vine, with its life-giving energy, is a vibrant and dynamic image of the Christian community. Just as the branch is dependent on the vine for food and life, we are dependent on Jesus for divine life and spiritual sustenance. Repeatedly, John's gospel emphasises the profound oneness that exists between each one of us and Christ, who is our life. It describes the importance of keeping in touch with Jesus, if his life giving blood is to flow within our veins. "Cut off from me you can do nothing". We can easily forget that as branches of the same vine, we are also connected to one another and called to form a community of love. It is not enough to have a personal relationship with Christ if we fail to reach out in love and understanding to those we meet in the course of our day. Our belonging to Jesus challenges us to move beyond ourselves and realise that we need each other.

Recipe for the Christian Life

Have you ever thought or heard someone say to you that the Catholic life if too complicated, with all the rules and regulations, the dos and don'ts? On the surface, prior to my encounter with Jesus, I would agree. On the surface, without encountering the living and risen Lord, we appear to focus on arbitrary rules and live to assert these rules on others; and in today's world of "you do you" this seems to restrict my freedom.

The reality and truth are, our faith is quite simple, not easy, but simple. All these rules and things of our faith are a gift from God to help us, in our brokenness to enter into a relationship with Jesus, to help us enter into prayer, into who God is, and surround ourselves with sacredness.

The readings this week give us the simple "recipe" of the Catholic life. In the second reading, God tells us to **keep**His commandments, all of them, not just the easy one's or the one's we're already living, but all of them; to walk in them and keep them. We're told to be holy, be righteous, be blameless.

From the first reading we're told **to remain in God** every day, not to depart from Him. Don't turn away from God, don't turn your attention from God; to set your eyes and gaze upon Him.

In the Gospel we're told that God is the vine and we're the branches. If we separate ourselves from the vine, we'll die. As the branches, the vine is how we get our water, our life, our sustenance.

When we remain attached to the Vine, to God, we'll keep growing and growing and growing. The gospel tells us **to bind ourselves to God** and we'll live.

This is the recipe of the Christian life. <u>Keep His</u> <u>commandments, remain in God and bind ourselves to</u> <u>Him.</u> This is simple, but not easy, this is more than difficult, it's impossible on our own. We need God's grace to live the Christian life well.

When we do this, what happens? We bear good fruit. This is how we know when we're following Jesus, when our will is His will. Is your life bearing good fruit? If it is, keep it up, if it's not, change it up. Doing this will not only bear great fruit, your life will never end, from now and through eternity.

This recipe will transform your life into something truly beautiful; it will allow you to be the person God created you to be, the person God designed you to be; it will allow you to live a life that is fully alive, an authentic human life, not superhuman, just wonderfully human.

So, keep God's commandments, remain in God and bind yourself to Him.
