

Because He First Loved Me

The Catholic philosopher Peter Kreeft once asked a group of university students what they would say if they were to die that very night, appear before God and be asked, "Why should I let you into heaven?" He collected the answers. They had one thing in common, they were all the wrong answers. They were all about the kinds of things we do for God, and made no mention of what God has done for us through his Son, Jesus Christ.

I myself have often had the same experience in ministry and in my own faith. For most of my life as a Catholic I have lacked a conviction that I cannot save myself. Rather than receive our Saviour through faith and live this faith out in love through good works, all of which are grounded in the free gift of God's grace, I mostly stive to be "nice" and thus earn God's love. Deep down many of us believe that unless we are some kind of reprobate like Hitler, we all really deserve salvation, because most people are really nice people. Salvation is something owed to us, not because of what God has done, or really even what I have done, but what I have not done(really, really bad things).

This perspective fails to take into account what we see happening in Genesis where God warns Adam and Eve that if they eat from the tree of the knowledge of Good and Evil they will surely die. They do it eat from it and they both die. Not physically but spiritually. It is not until our Baptism and participation in the life, death and resurrection of Christ that we are Spiritually revived and are filled once again with the Ruach or Spirit of God we received when God first breathed into our nostrils the breath of Life.

This was my experience when I was baptized as an adult. I felt as though something that existed within me but was lying dormant came to life, that my Spiritual Life was resurrected and a new world was opened up for me.

Our Spiritual Life like our physical life needs to be nurtured if we hope to grow and not fall back into death. This is accomplished in many ways through prayer, fasting, almsgiving and good works but primarily through the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ, the feast we celebrate this weekend. The Eucharist is more than Christ's earthly body, it is his divinized heavenly Body and a foretaste of the heavenly banquet we will fully experience when God will be all in all. The Eucharist is supernatural and when it enters our body we are assimiliated into it, working our redemption and intimate incorporation into the Divine Body, the very Life of God.

So, when our eventual time comes and we are asked, "Why should I let you into heaven?" We can lovingly sing: "Because He first loved me." John Humphries.


