

Drawing Water

We heard in a recent Gospel that nothing outside a person that by going in can defile them, rather it is the things that come out of a person that defile them. This is due to our exercise of free will. In the same vein, it is the things that come out of a person that purify and make them holy.

We see this beautifully illustrated in one of my favourite biblical encounters between Jesus and the Woman of Samaria. In this encounter we witness Jesus tired by his journey resting by Jacob's well. When the Samaritan woman approaches the well, he asks her to draw some water and give him a drink. The woman surprised and intrigued by his boldness asks him why he is breaking cultural convention and asking a Samaritan woman to draw him water. They enter into a dialogue and through their conversation, the woman has a conversion experience and leaves the encounter not only a follower but a disciple proceeding to share the good news with her community.

In my own life, I am reluctant to be like Jesus and ask a friend or a family member to draw water for me. I am reluctant for many different reasons such as: I shouldn't ask for help if I can try to do it myself, I am worried the other person will get upset and think less of me and I am concerned their help will somehow be insufficient. After reflecting on this reading, I have realized my desire for independence has limited the opportunities for those around me to grow closer to me and God.

Not that we try to take advantage of our neighbour, but we invite our brothers and sisters into a reciprocal sharing of gifts and talents that is at the heart of every loving relationship. With Jesus at the centre we need not fear being exploited or exploiting our neighbour, for God purifies our interrelations. Jesus invites us to take on his yoke to lighten the load and to do the same with others. When I imagine Jesus drawing water from within me, I find it Life giving to feel the Holy Spirit discovering resources and a strength that I wasn't even aware was there. In the same way when I am reflecting about drawing water from the people in my life I pray and ask Jesus for the grace to approach them as he approached the Samaritan woman.

In our Gospel this weekend, we are invited to lose our lives for Jesus' sake and for the sake of the Gospel and we will save them. We lose our lives by entrusting ourselves to God's and our neighbour's providence, to draw water from those around us and to be drawn likewise. Unlike earthly wells that eventually run dry our spiritual wells produce eternal water, a fresh, bubbling spring within us, giving us eternal life. Amen.
