

## Je Me Souviens

Recently I was preparing a retreat and as the retreat got closer my fears started to kick in. Questions started filling my head like: What if I don't get everything ready on time? What if it doesn't go well? Fears I am sure we all experience from time to time.

As I was praying, I brought my fears to the Lord and sheepishly shared: "the usual fears are here can you help?" As I remained in prayer, I could feel God reminding me: "I have always been with you, why would this time be any different. Just remember. Reluctantly I accepted God's invitation to remember and immediately felt a sense of peace. Everything ended up going well and God blessed the event in many unexpected ways. All I needed was to remember God's faithfulness and ask myself, "Do I really think that God will abandon me at this point when He never has?"

We see Jesus doing this with Mary Magdalene and the other Mary following his resurrection when they were distraught and mourning over his passing. Jesus appears to them and tells them not to be afraid but to go and tell his brothers to go to Galilee and they will see him there. Jesus is true to his word and appears to the eleven disciples on the mountain to which he directed them giving them all authority in heaven and on earth to make disciples of nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and to remember that He is with them always, to the end of the age. Jesus could have commissioned the disciples in Jerusalem but instead invites them back to where the majority of his ministry took place and the foundation was laid in Galilee. He brings them back to where their memories were strongest and instructs them to remember.

Memory is the foundation of the covenantal relationship between God and his Chosen People also. Throughout the Old Testament, we witness God and the prophets encouraging the people not to forget the promise made to them in the beginning that Yahweh would be their God and they would be his people, despite their propensity to forget.

This week we encounter Jesus' greatest healing in Mark as Bartimaeus is healed of blindness. As Jesus is leaving Jericho, Bartimaeus calls out: 'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me.' In calling Jesus, 'Son of David' we see Bartimaeus remembering the prophetic promise made to David that a son of his would sit on his throne forever. A promise that many of the Jews of Jesus' time had forgotten or refused to remember. It was a promise that Bartimaeus never lost hope in. Like the blind man we too are invited to be pillars of hope in our world of fear calling out with Bartimaeus: 'Jesus, Son of David have mercy on me,' remembering God's faithfulness, his love and his providence. Amen.
