

One of the most important things Jesus ever said...

"This is one of the most important things Jesus ever said. It is also one of the most famous. And it is also one of the clearest. And yet there is a deep mystery to it. When Jesus replied calmly, "you are not far from the Kingdom of God," What did he mean? Why was the scribe not fully in Christ's Kingdom - In fact, in its very center? What more was there? For Jesus there is always more. ... Everything he says suggests something more, like a scent that triggers a distant memory that hovers just beyond your mind's grasp. His words come from a mind that we do not fully comprehend. ... When he is questioned, he sometimes seems to avoid the question, but he never does: He always goes to the very heart of the question, or, rather, to the very heart of the questioner. ... The scribe in today's Gospel also longs to understand & to enter the Kingdom of God,...& he understands that that reign must exist in souls, not just in states; Within, not just without. Jesus' use of the political term "kingdom" was a sign, a political symbol, not a political reality. ... Christ spoke about nothing more often than "the kingdom of God." It was His central theme because it was His central purpose. Christ came to earth to establish the "Kingdom. God," & His church is the Kingdom of God. There are many definitions of the church, but probably the two deepest ones are "the Mystical Body of Christ" & "the People of God." The two seem opposite: The first, "the Mystical Body of Christ," is invisible, & the second, "the People of God," is visible. The first is mysterious, & the second is clear. The first is cosmic, & the second is person. The first is divine, and the second is human. But the two definitions should never be separated, but always seem together. The Church of Christ is both. Invisible & visible, both internal, in souls, and external, in the visible reality. It's both very mysterious & very clear.... It's both cosmic and personal. It's both divine & human like Christ himself. It's Christ himself, his Body. Your body is you, not one of your possessions. We do not have a body: you are a body-just as you do not have a soul: you are a soul. "The full Christ" is both head & body. As your head & body are one, Christ the head & the Church his body are one.

He is always more, much more, than we think we have, more than we think we understand, and he will always be that forever in heaven. ... And so even when the best possible answer in words is given to a tremendously important question, as Jesus gave us in today's Gospel, there is always more than the surface. Not less, never less, always more: more truth, more goodness, more beauty; more light, more love, more life; more understanding, more charity, more joy. There's always more in his words because he is the Word of God, and there's always more in God, infinitely & forever."


