A Treasure of Surprises

A time of the year especially synonymous with surprises is Christmas. I am sure everyone can recall the feeling of opening an unexpected gift and the joy that it brought. Our God is a God of surprises and inspires us to share our love in new and unexpected ways.

Mary and Joseph's lives were full of surprises too. One such surprise is found in our Gospel this weekend where Jesus remains in Jerusalem after his family's departure. After searching for 3 days Mary and Joseph were astonished to find Jesus sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. Despite her anxiety, Mary treasured this in her heart.
