Each year on Palm Sunday, we read an account of the Passion of Jesus. As we listen to it, we are reminded of the cowardice of the followers who abandoned him in his greatest hour of need, of the wickedness of the religious leaders who plotted his death, and of the cruelty of the soldiers who carried out his execution. We are reminded of these things because we have a kinship with them, but that is not the purpose of the Passion reading.

The emphasis is on Jesus. What we are remembering is the fidelity, the courage, and the sheer goodness of Jesus. Against the darkness of the Calvary, his goodness shines even more brightly. The day of his death is not called "Bad Friday" but "Good Friday". What makes it good is the love of Jesus, "Greater love no man has than to lay down his life for his friends." It is that love that we remember this week. It is the triumph of good over evil, of love over hate, of light over darkness and of life over death.

#### **Entering Holy Week**

We enter into a week made "holy" forever by the selfsurrendering love of Jesus as we remember how he loved us. Whatever we do, no matter how busy or "distracted" we might be, we can let the power of this week be in the background of our daily reflections.

He entered into our world - with its profound joys and its punishing evils - that we might never experience those struggles alone. So, no matter what we experience this week, we can let it become a "holy" week, letting it all be touched by the graces and intimate presence of Jesus.

From the humble, yet triumphant, entry into Jerusalem, to our standing together at the foot of his cross, this can be a week, which helps us bring all of the elements of our lives, all our experiences of sin and death, into the font of his redeeming, liberating death and resurrection.

Since the beginning of Lent until now, we have prepared our hearts by penance and charitable works. Now with all faith and devotion, let us commemorate the Lord's entry into the city for our salvation, following in his footsteps. For in Holy Week, we seek the special grace of being united to Jesus as we ourselves cope with the suffering in our troubled world and in our personal lives. Like Jesus, we may feel abandoned by God. But like Jesus we are not alone. Just as the Father was with Jesus transforming Jesus through suffering, so Jesus is now with us transforming us through our own suffering!

On Holy Thursday, we witness the betrayal of Jesus at the Last Supper, as we ponder who I am most like in the narrative? Regardless of who we are, we witness the extravagant love of Jesus who kneels in front of his disciples and one by one washes their feet. He was so deeply moved for he ...knew that his hour had come to pass from this world...He loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end. He understood that he was soon to say good-bye and he wanted to express himself in the tenderest of ways.

Entering Good Friday, we accompany Jesus interiorly from Gethsemane to the Cross humbly asking him to share what was going through his heart at this most difficult time? Not that this will give us a full grasp of his passion and death, but it will help us to grow in solidarity with Jesus and, by "entering" his heart, we can discover a deeper meaning of the devotion to the Heart of Jesus.

Finally, we arrive at Holy Saturday, a final day to reflect on our Lenten journeys and to prepare to enter into the world's most important revelation and celebration that Jesus is alive and with us! Amen. Adapted from Creighton Online Ministries by John Humphries.
