Pointing the Finger

My family rented a cottage this summer and had a great time. It was so nice to be away and spend some quiet time together. The cottage we rented was in disrepair in a number of ways: old furniture, broken doors and missing items etc. but we accepted these as part of its charm.

When our stay was over, we left the cottage in immaculate condition as we always try to do. A few hours on our way, we received a message from the owners and expected it to be a note of thanks but much to our surprise it wasn't. Instead, it was a note accusing us of dishonesty listing how much we owed in damages. We were shocked to see they were asking us to pay for repairs to an old chair, screens and dining table imperfections. All items from our perspective were far past their best before dates and the damages were caused as a result of normal use not negligence.

We explained this to the owners and accused them of dishonesty for attempting to get us to pay for items in need of replacement. The accusations continued to fly and eventually they accepted it was not our responsibility to pay. Despite this small victory, the initial accusation tainted the wonderful cottage experience and left us feeling wounded. Not only because of their accusations but because of our own.

Reflecting on the experience, the wisdom of an exorcist came to mind. He shared that one of the goals of the evil one is to accuse and one definition of the name Satan is Accuser. He describes how the devil deceives us and then through the deception brings division which leads us to divert from the path with Jesus and ultimately leads to our destruction. Rather than peacefully dealing with the situation in a Christ-centered way we both resorted to accusations. Through our accusations, we became divided and diverted from the path with Jesus, which would have led to reconciliation and took the path of destruction, a ruptured relationship.

Thanks to our faith and recognizing this destructive pattern my wife and I chose not to leave a negative review on the owner's website and perpetuate the cycle of violence. Since this happened as a family we try to be more aware of accusations and the destructive power they have. When we begin to point a finger, we try bringing to mind who may be motivating us to do so.

It's interesting that in the middle of the battle while I was praying Jesus invited me to respond with love and not more accusations. Unfortunately, I ignored his invitation as my pride got in the way, and I had to prove I was right. It is said that in the Divine Courtroom it will be Jesus' Blood proving us right as we all sit in silence.
